The Board met with Engineer Ryan Schock, who reported on blading, rock hauling and ditching work being completed by the County crews. He further reported that dust control spray applications will begin this week for citizens who have purchased that service from vendors, Binns and Heffron. He also reported the Department Transportation (DOT) is requiring new center rumbles be cut south and east of Drakesville at a cost of \$15,000 in order for the County to qualify for the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) grant in the amount of \$420,000.00.
