The Davis County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Monday, March 23, 2026 with Chairman Ron Bride and Members David Henderson and Alan Yahnke present. Because of the Fiscal Year 2027 Proposed Property Tax Levy Hearing running long, the regular meeting was not called to order until 8:50 a.m.

David Henderson made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve the agenda.

David Henderson made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve and sign the Minutes of Monday, March 16, 2026.

The Board met with Engineer Ryan Schock, who reported on the blading, rock hauling and brush cutting activities of the County crews. Engineer Schock further reported Calhoun-Burns delivered their 2025 bridge inspection report summary to his office showing zero bridges closed, 20 bridges with less than five years of life remaining and three bridges with maintenance issues, being two box culverts needing rip-rap and one brush log jam.

David Henderson made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve signing a Southern Iowa Development and Conservation Authority (SIDCA) project application for the Jade Avenue bridge.

Alan Yahnke made motion, seconded by David Henderson and carried unanimously, to publish the proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2027 and set the date and time for public hearing at 10:00 a.m. on April 6, 2026.

The Board discussed maintenance needs for some of the Courthouse benches. Custodian Andy Garland will be directed to continue removing brackets from the benches in need of repair which will then be delivered to a blacksmith for repair or replacement.

During the Committee and Department Reports section of the meeting, Sheriff Zach Dunlavy reported having had two individuals participate and pass a physical fitness test given by his office in search of Reserve Sheriff's Deputies. One of the individuals has past reserve deputy sheriff experience. Sheriff Dunlavy will be in communication with the Law Enforcement Academy in Ankeny for guidance on next steps in the process to possibly certify these individuals as reserve deputies. Sheriff Dunlavy further reported that on April 2, his department will be partnering with the National Guard Civil Support Unit in a training/drill at the northwest corner of Bloomfield near the Apostolic Christian Church. His office will notify the public of this event with a Facebook post.

All Board members reported on committee meetings attended.
