The Davis County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Monday, May 18, 2026 with Chairman Ron Bride and Members David Henderson and Alan Yahnke present.

David Henderson made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve the agenda.

Ron Bride made motion, seconded by David Henderson and carried unanimously, to approve and sign the Minutes of Monday, May 11, 2026. Alan Yahnke abstained as he was absent from the May 11 meeting.

The Board met with Engineer Ryan Schock, who reported on the blading, rock hauling, ditching and cross-road pipe repair work of the County crews. He further reported having scheduled three interviews from 8 applications for the open position of Common Laborer in his department. Engineer Schock informed the Board that Cantera Aggregates, LLC notified him their rock prices are raising from \$13.45 to \$14.95 per ton due to diesel prices. He noted having received no indication from Douds Stone, LLC of a change in their rock price per ton. A group of concerned citizens were again present to express concerns and asked questions of the Engineer, the Maintenance Supervisor and the Board regarding a variety of county roads, ditches, road width and crown height. After much conversation, it was decided that this year's regrade project for 160<sup>th</sup> Street would include only that portion from the Dunnville Baptist Church heading west to Highway 63.

At 10:00 a.m., Chairman Ron Bride called to open a public hearing for the FY2025-26 Budget Amendment. There being no written or oral comments given, Alan Yahnke made motion, seconded by David Henderson and carried unanimously to close the hearing. David Henderson made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve the FY2025-26 budget amendment.

Alan Yahnke made motion, seconded by David Henderson and carried unanimously, to approve the biennial GASB (Governmental Accounting Standards Board) actuarial service agreement with Howard E. Nyhart Company, Inc., at a cost of \$3,100 for Fiscal Year 2026 and \$2,500 for Fiscal Year 2027.

During the Committee and Departments Reports section of the meeting, Sheriff Zach Dunlavy was present to advise the Board of the following: because of a resignation, a jailer position will be open in his department; Baird Brothers Painting donated their time to spray new parking spaces at the Law Center parking lot, the only expense to the County being that of materials; ongoing communications with insurance company regarding a claim for damages as a result of a tower being struck by lightning; requests by the City of Drakesville to install a four-way stop sign near Sines Gas N Go, LLC at the intersection of Washington and Main Streets because of speeding concerns. The group discussed the possibility of erecting a speed monitor that would flash the miles per hour rate of speed of passing motorists could be a solution.
